Drakes Bay Oyster Farm is gone. The retail operation and cannery were forced to shut down July 31, 2014. Harvesting was ended December 31, 2014. The Park Service has destroyed the historic buildings of the shore operation, and is planning the destruction of the underwater oyster racks in 2016.



The farm was a wonderful opportunity to learn about shellfish farming operations first-hand and purchase the best fresh oysters in California. Generations of visitors have fond memories of purchasing oysters to take home or to enjoy at the farm's picnic tables overlooking beautiful Drakes Estero.
